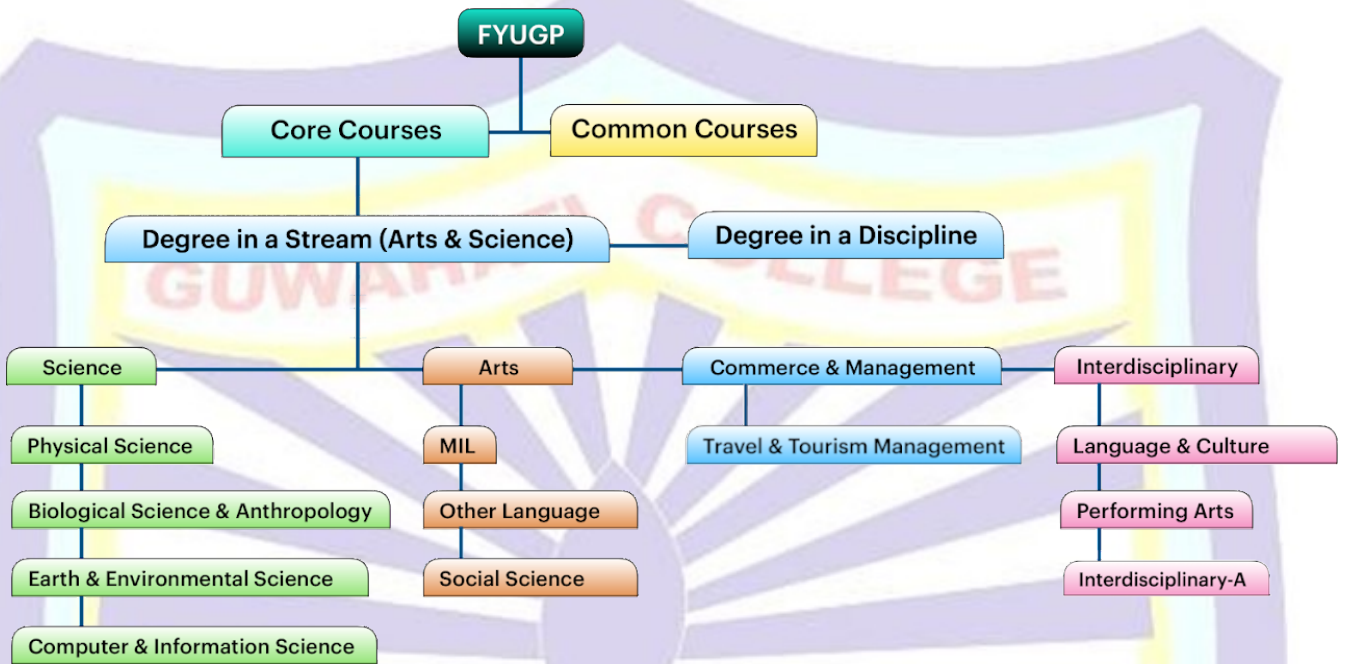

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- A candidate shall apply for admission through the Assam State Higher Education Admission Portal-SAMARTH PORTAL ONLY (<https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>). The link will be available on the college website as well to register and proceed with the further application process.
- Admission will be strictly on a merit basis. A confirmation message will be sent to the Samarth User ID of the respective candidate. After accepting the offer from the concerned Institution, a candidate will be considered as **PROVISIONALLY SELECTED FOR ADMISSION**.
- The admission committee of the college will conduct physical verification of the relevant documents on the day of admission. After successful verification and fee payment, the final admission will be confirmed.
- The candidates whose names appear in the merit list but fail to get admitted on the specified date will forfeit their claim.
- Reservation of seats for SC, ST(P), ST(H), OBC/MOBC, EWS, PwD, and sports and extracurricular activity quota will be done as per Assam Government regulation.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

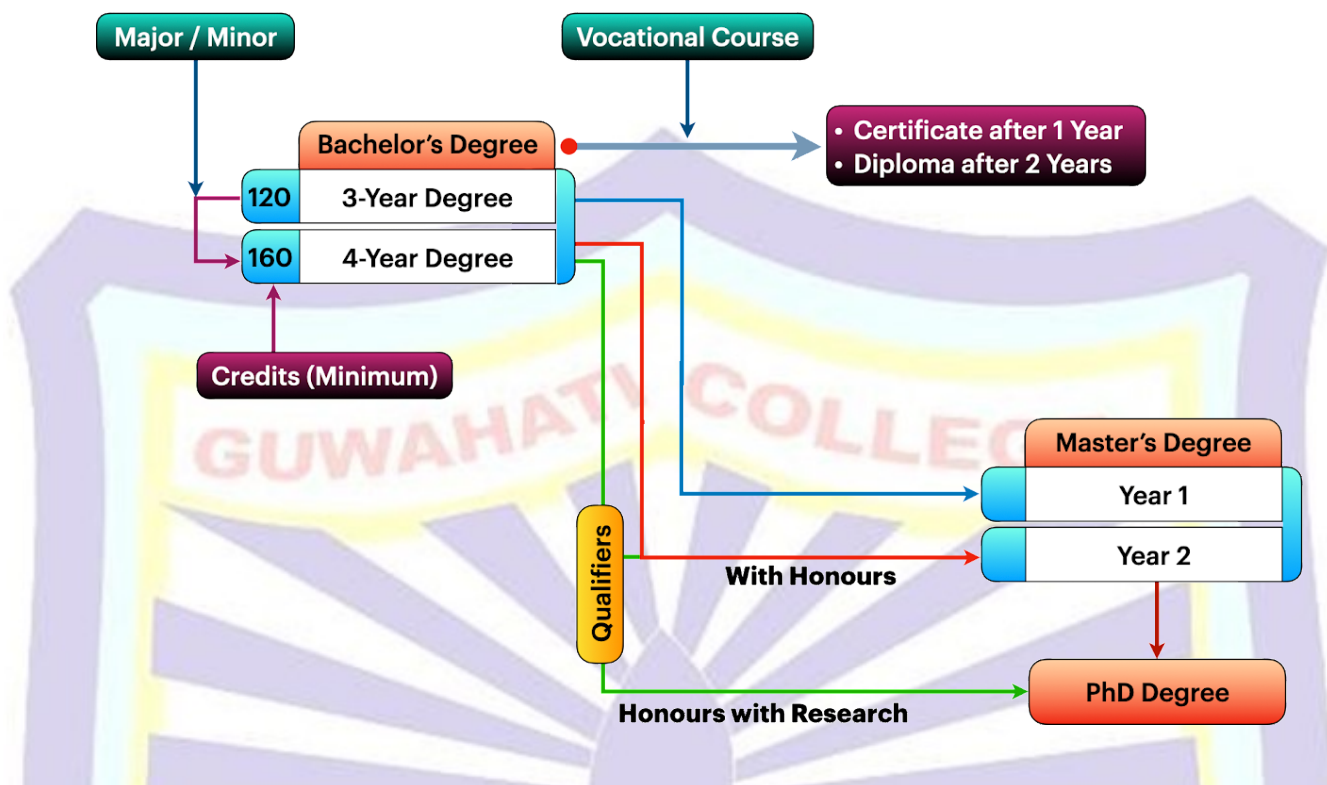
A student who has passed the 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution is eligible to apply.

Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, s/he will be admitted based on preferences of the subject combinations.

Admission to a programme or major will be subject to the availability of the subject and capacity of a college/department.

No student shall be eligible for admission to a programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless he/she fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by Gauhati university.

GUWAHATI COLLEGE: A BRIEF INTRODUCTION

Guwahati College, situated in the eastern part of Guwahati is one of the premier institutions of Assam for higher learning in the region. It has strength of nearly three thousand students, who are ably guided towards the achievement of their goals, by a highly qualified and experienced teaching community.

The College was started on 3rd August 1964 at Chandmari, Guwahati. Later, it was shifted to its permanent building in Bamunimaidam at Jyotinagar. The College has now traversed through half a century, successfully contributing to the upliftment of the society. It is now one of the most reputed Colleges of Assam where students from all over the Northeastern Part of India get admitted.

Guwahati College has completed 59 glorious years of existence and was re-accredited (Cycle 3) by NAAC with Grade B++ with a CGPA of 2.91 in 2023. The College now stands as a full- fledged Institution of higher learning equipped with the latest educational technology. The infrastructure reflects the development of the College with its well-stocked library, departmental libraries, seminar halls, well-equipped laboratories, and a beautiful playground. The College has its own unique Anthem. At present, the college has three streams.

The Mission of the College:

The mission of the College is to TEACH. The term here stands for:

The Vision of the College:

Guwahati College has the vision to attain the status of an autonomous educational institution with all its stakeholders making substantial differences in our modes of thinking and patterns of living. The College wants to ensure that the real fruits of modern education spill over the confines of the classroom, resulting in the well-being of the planet and all things living.

Guwahati College attempts to understand the social needs of the country and prepare the students accordingly to fill up those needs. Many of the programme undertaken by the college focus on innovation and entrepreneurship with an aim to contribute its mite to national progress and development on all fronts.

College Emblem:

The College emblem with its motto is highly suggestive of the institution's mission and vision. In appearance, the emblem resembles a lotus in partial bloom. This highlights the Nationalistic spirit that prevails in the College. It also suggests opportunity for the students to prosper. This image further emphasizes the optimistic spirit that forms the basis of the mission of the College, which is "the will to develop and improve further".

The figure of the open book implies the propagation of education while the alternate dark and white lines suggest the College's endeavor to reach out to humanity in its entirety without any prejudice against caste, creed or color. The earthen lamp, illuminating the surroundings to remove any darkness of ignorance, forms the motto of spreading the light of knowledge. The small dots represent the multitude that is expected to be benefitted by the propagation of knowledge.

Attendance Requirements

- ❖ To be eligible to appear at a University Examination every student has to attend a minimum of 75% of the lectures, practical and tutorials held during the academic session.
- ❖ The principal shall have the power to strike off the name of a student who is grossly irregular in attendance.
- ❖ Students remaining absent on medical grounds should submit a medical certificate from the appropriate authority while rejoining college. However, absence on Medical Grounds does not mean that they will be exempted from any kind of examination.

Discipline

The college expects its student to conduct themselves in a disciplined and dignified manner in the college and outside. Students must follow the following rules:

1. Students are responsible for their conduct and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside or outside the college that will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college.
2. Interference of any outside pressure group in the internal affairs of the college is strictly prohibited.
3. Students are expected to have regard and consideration for each other and be respectful to the teachers, members of the college staff and fellow students.
4. Unbecoming language or ungentlemanly conduct shall be severely dealt with.
5. Students shall maintain perfect silence in classrooms and desist from disorderly behaviour. They are expected not to walk about or make noise in the corridors or in front of classrooms and must keep as quiet as possible at all times. During their free periods students should work quietly in the Library or Reading Room, or spend the time in the Students Common Room, but without causing any disturbance.
6. Students shall take proper care of the college property, furniture and premises. They must not cause damage to or tamper with college property, furniture and fittings.
7. Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters or motorcycles locked in the parking shed provided for this purpose. No bicycle, scooter or motorcycle shall be parked in any other part of the college campus.
8. No society can be formed in the college nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the college without the permission of the Principal.
9. Notices designed to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the college

premises shall require the approval of the Principal.

10. Students shall not spoil or misuse the lawns or any other space of the college.
11. Communal harmony must be maintained.
12. Students suffering from any contagious or infectious diseases will not be permitted to attend the college. They will be allowed to rejoin classes only after producing a fitness certificate from the appropriate authority.
13. It is mandatory for students to come to college in proper College uniform during class days as well as on other working days.
14. Smoking, chewing tobacco and spitting betel-nut inside the college campus is considered as a punishable event.
15. Students shall not loiter around in college uniform outside the college campus.
16. Parents / Guardians must monitor their wards during their study in the College.

Ragging:

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the college premises or outside the campus. Guwahati College is committed to provide a ragging free academic environment to the students. The college in principle adheres to the UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009 and accordingly constituted an anti-ragging committee to ensure a ragging-free campus. Any act of the following will be considered as an act of ragging:

- Involvement in physical assault or threat or use of physical force.
- Violation of the status, dignity, and honor of students.
- Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
- Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behavior

Monitoring of academic progress:

The Principal, teachers, IQAC and the academic monitoring cell of the college make regular effort during the academic session to make first-hand assessments of the academic progress of the students or any problems related to teaching and learning.

Guardians meet:

Guardians meet is conducted for interaction between the Principal, teachers and parents/guardians of students. Guardians are encouraged to attend such meetings to express their opinions on academic and other developmental matters of their wards.

Facilities and Features

1. Academic calendar and class schedule

The academic calendar is available in the college website. Time-table will be available during the commencement of the new session.

2. Travelling concession

Students are entitled to railway/air concessions to and from their homes during vacation and for travelling on academic tours organized by the college.

3. Students aid fund

The college has instituted a student aid fund. The objectives of the fund are:

- (a) To render financial assistance to the economically backward and deserving students whose father's /guardian's income falls below BPL norms of the Government.
- (b) To meet any other need of the students considered to be genuine by the College authority.

A student requiring financial aid shall have to apply to the Principal of the College with an income certificate given by the competent authority.

4. Students' association and co-curricular activities

Guwahati College Students' Union society is the general body of the students of this college. Every student of the college is a member of this Society. The office bearers of the union are elected annually. The Union endeavors to promote fraternity, mutual understanding, and a sense of responsibility among the students and work for the all-round development of the college. The Union also organizes games and sports, debating, and cultural activities among the students, under the guidance of the teachers and the college authority.

5. The College magazine

The Guwahati College Magazine is published annually. The Magazine publishes articles by teachers, students, and office staff and reviews of the educational, cultural, social, and sports activities of the college. The magazine is edited by a student editor under the supervision of a member of the teaching staff. The college also publishes an annual news bulletin.

6. Library

The College has a well-stocked three-storeyed central library. The library is open from 9 am to 4 pm on all days except Sundays and holidays. Students can borrow books from the library

for two weeks. The library is well equipped with a Xerox machine, internet facility, and airy and spacious reading rooms for teachers and students. SOUL 2.0 software is being used for library automation. N-List (INFLIBNET) is available in the library. The digital library facilitates in viewing and downloading various in-house publications like College magazine, bulletin, etc. The library subscribes to a large number of dailies, weeklies, periodicals, and journals on a variety of subjects. Membership to the library, issue/return of books, and searching/referencing of books, all this information can be obtained from the Librarian. Books on loan with members can be recalled at any time if necessary. Books kept in the reserve section are not issued on loan.

7. College notice board

All important notices and information to students are displayed on the Notice board. Students are advised to see the notice board regularly.

8. Career counselling cum placement cell

Guwahati College has a career counselling cell. The Cell's objective is to help students in seeking employment besides providing vocational guidance. The cell organizes counseling sessions with in-house faculty or experts from outside. The cell subscribes to employment news and weekly employment news and displays relevant news on the notice board. Campus interviews are conducted for placement into various MNCs, nationalized banks etc.

9. Internal Complaint Committee (ICC)

The grievance redressal cell and ICC of the college look into the grievance or complaint of a teacher/student/parent/staff. A grievance or a complaint can be conveyed in writing to the cell in the prescribed form.

10. NCC

The college has a full-fledged national cadet corps, army wing, for both boys and girls. Regular training is imparted throughout the year by trained NCC officers. There are many award and scholarship schemes for eligible cadets including Vir Chilarai Award, Sahara scholarship etc. It is worth mentioning that NCC 'C' certificate holders have various opportunities for Govt. services and for getting scholarships like entry in defense services, telecommunications, etc., Youth exchange program, community development, personality development, adventure training, and shooting are being taught to the cadets in the regular Sunday classes in the college premises. Students willing to join the NCC can contact the

respective Professors-in-charge after the commencement of the academic session.

11. NSS

The National Service Scheme unit of the college is actively engaged in various community welfare services. Under this scheme, the college unit has shown its proficiency not only at the State or Regional level but also in the National as well as in the International scenario. Students desiring to join the NSS can contact the respective programme officer after the commencement of the academic session.

12. Sports

The college maintains a good playground where football, volleyball and cricket are played. Students of the college have consistently performed well in inter-college competitions at the youth meet organized by GU.

13. History study centre

The department of History has started this centre in the year 1999, with a view to popularize and promote the study of history.

14. The disaster management cell

The college has constituted a disaster management cell. The objective of this cell is to create awareness amongst people to face any kind of natural hazard like earthquake, flood, cyclone etc. and prepare them to learn to survive such calamities.

15. Guwahati College women's forum

The Guwahati College women's forum was set up with the prime objective of helping girl students of the College in extra-curricular activities and making women of neighboring areas aware of hygiene and socio-economic matters. The forum organizes various programme related to women issues.

16. Alumni association

The college has an Alumni association. Alumni can enroll as well as communicate through our website: www.guwahaticollege.org.in

17. Mountaineering club

The college has a mountaineering club registered under Assam rock and sport climbing association (ARSCA) affiliated to Indian mountaineering foundation. The club was

established in the year 1985. The aim of the club is to promote adventure sports and mountaineering skills among students under the technical support of ARSCA. The club was established in the year 1985. The club also organizes adventure camps and basic skills of rock climbing regularly.

18. Skill development and entrepreneurship cell

Skill development and entrepreneurship cell is constituted in the College and has been successfully conducting student-centric activities. The cell has been instrumental in facilitating industry-institution linkage and trained under NSIC. Students are mentored to engage in Skill based activities and develop entrepreneurial temperament.

19. Institution innovation cell (IIC)

Ministry of education (MOE), Govt. of India has established innovation cells in all higher educational institutions to systematically foster the culture of Innovation amongst all HEIs. The college has initiated an IIC involving a number of faculties, domain experts and students.

20. Eco club

Eco club of Guwahati College is a part of National green corps (NGC), an initiative of ministry of environment, forest and climate change (MoEFCC). The eco club works to inculcate sustainable and eco-friendly practices in the campus. The eco club of Guwahati College has been recognized as an excellent eco club by Govt. of Assam for the year 2021-2022.

21. Electoral literacy club (ELC)

Through the ELCs, the Election Commission of India aims at strengthening the culture of electoral participation among young and future voters. Through the ELC, the college engages college students to familiarize them with the electoral process. The club has faculty members as conveners and student members as campus ambassadors.

22. Ecotreato

It is a platform for direct sales and promotion of handmade products and services initiated by the department of Economics. Through this platform, assistance and support is provided to students who wish to trade in any kinds of handmade products and services.

23. Yoga and meditation cell

Guwahati College has been running a yoga and meditation centre in the college. The yoga and

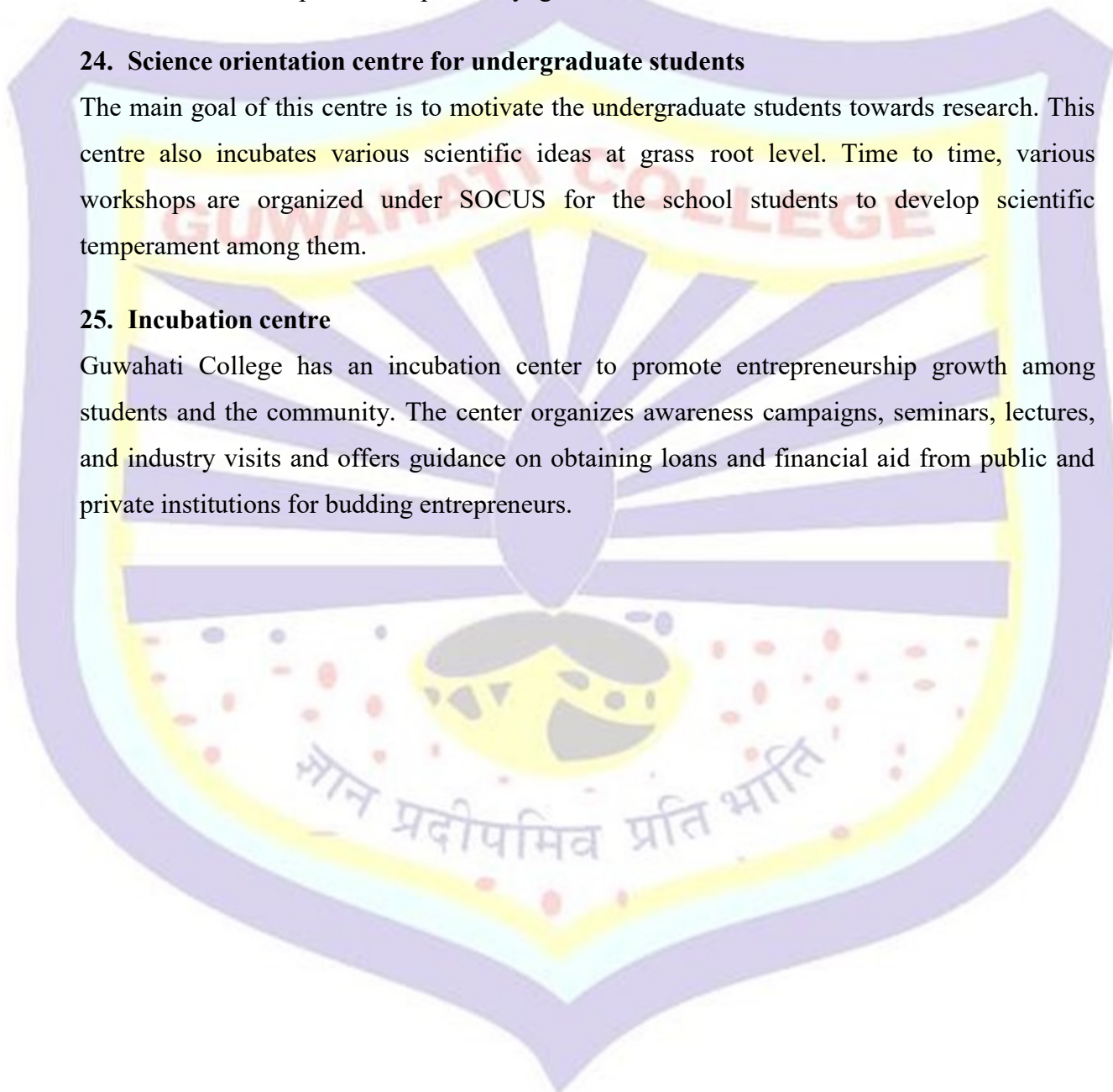
meditation centre was started for both students and staff with a lot of objectives like making students understand the importance of maintaining good health, both physically and mentally, to have an understanding of life and peaceful living, educating students on the spiritual dimension and how it affects our lives, teaching yoga methods of warding off unnecessary stress and improving concentration. The yoga and meditation centre conducts sessions on both theoretical and practical aspects of yoga and meditation.

24. Science orientation centre for undergraduate students

The main goal of this centre is to motivate the undergraduate students towards research. This centre also incubates various scientific ideas at grass root level. Time to time, various workshops are organized under SOCUS for the school students to develop scientific temperament among them.

25. Incubation centre

Guwahati College has an incubation center to promote entrepreneurship growth among students and the community.
